# Speaker of the Month: Nick Curcioni

Note saltwater flyfisher Nick Curcioni will be our March 11 speaker. Nick has published both nationally and internationally, and is currently on the Orvis saltwater advisory staff. He wrote the Orvis Guide to Saltwater Flyfishing and is the regional editor for Flyfishing in Saltwater

Mr. Curcioni grew up in Southern California and became a pioneer of Westcoast saltwater flyfishing. He is presently on sabbatical from Loyola Marymount University.

The talk on Monday night will center on the Baja area and includes fishing for dorado, sailfish, rooster fish, pampano, and croaker. Nick will arrive at the meeting early so we can have a chance to see him tie some flies, and observe techniques for leader set-ups and materials. Plan to attend this informative talk.



## WOMEN IN FLYFISHING By Jean Sedar

For those of you who were unable to attend our last meeting. on February 5, I gave the group a synopsis of an exciting program the Federation of Fly Fishers has created to get more women involved with fly fishing. This is especially momentous as 1996 marks the 500th anniversary of the publication of the "Treatise of Fishing with an Angle," attributed to Dame Juliana Berners. The "Treatise," for the angling world, is recognized as the first writing on modern sport rishing.

The Southwest Council
Women's Educational Fly Fishing
Program is a pilot program beginning within our very own Southwest Council of the national FFF, of
which Santa Barbara Flyfishers is
affiliate. Maggie Merriman,
oted flyfisher, instructor, and now
the National Coordinator for this
new FFF program, envisions a

"Grass Roots Level" involvement with one woman representative from each of the clubs within our Southwest Council. Women's classes have proved to work, and whenever possible, this program will provide women teaching women.

Both national and international events are happening which indicate women are wanting to learn about and become involved in fly fishing. Locally, this was proven by last year's high attendance and rave reviews of the Becoming an Outdoors-Woman program the DFG put on at Rancho Alegre with on-site fly fishing classes at the Santa Ynez River. This year the demand is so high they will choose attendants by lottery. (I will be teaching the Basic Fishing and On-Water classes and hope to see some of our local ladies in those sessions!)

Some of the first events the Southwest Council Women's Educational Fly Fishing Program will sponsor are scheduled for March 16 and 17 at the Southwest Fly Fishing Show at the Orange County Fairgrounds. I will be coinstructing the Introduction to Fly Fishing seminar on Saturday from 11 a.m. to 12 noon for any age and gender. My partner there will be Kate Howe, a colorful character with an excellent reputation as a guide and fly tier. (I have humbly offered my services to be her go-fer during her fly tying seminar from 3 to 4 p.m. that same day.) "Catching Fish and Releasing Stress" will be my slide show on fly fishing Alaska on Saturday. Come on by the FFF booth at the fairgrounds if you attend this renowned event!
