Pursuing Trinity Steelhead

Since the welcome big rainstorms hit California at the first part of January, the steelhead fishing in Northern California has been better than it has in years. Guides on rivers on the North Coast have been reporting 5-6 Steelhead per day using a fly rod.

Dick Compton and I have enjoyed chasing steelhead for the past decade. We have become proficient at using two handed rods for swinging flies to Steelhead. We enjoy exploring rivers on foot and we relish catching fish while casting to them from a drift boat. Last year we did not do any Steelhead trips because of the COVID pandemic. Last week we decided to go to the Trinity River for our first Steelhead outing of 2022. Another incentive that got us fired up was a report from a fellow fly club member, George Zengel, who floated the Trinity River for two days and

caught six Steelhead.

Dick and I booked three days with our guide Matt Mitchell. Matt grew up around Weaverville where his grandparents own a piece of property that has been in the family for many years. Matt learned about fishing the local lakes and rivers from his grandfather and his father.

We stayed at the Indian Creek Lodge which is about 10 miles up river from Weaverville. We like it there because there is good fishing right out the back door and there is access to several good sections of the river nearby. We secured a room with a kitchenette so we could cook our meals at the Lodge. Weaverville is suffering from a lack of tourism, industry development, and a slow economy during COVID. Many of the restaurants, from days gone by, are shuttered. A few

She always joked about the club being her whole social life. I guess that was her way of nagging a bunch of guys on the board not to let the club down and it keep working towards its



mission and vision.

Diane had a talent for asking questions and seeing problems. She was at her best solving difficulties and while I don't think she relished this, she never avoided moving towards resolving problems and working on solutions. I think back over the years and all her kind interactions when difficulties appeared in club matters. In the end she was always a part of the solution if in nothing more in the that the problem was confronted, resolved; and in her words "huh", time to move on and think about going fishing.

She did not burden us with her battle with breast cancer this past year. She did not bother us her difficult time with her business and the pandemic. She died at home just after Christmas after a brief remission from the cancer.

I hope she took solace in this past year in the truth that she did good for us all and that she was respected and loved by her fellow fly fishers. She leaves us with more than "stuff". She traveled far and wide and those places we all wish to fish. A widow, and she never burdened us with that, only to be a vicar of sorts to her late husband in the example, of the joy, and love we can share doing things together.

places were still open and on Thursday night we met George Zengel for dinner at the Trinity Alps Golf Course Restaurant.

On Monday, our first day of fishing, we swung flies as we walked downriver from the lodge to Indian Creek.

The next three days we fished with Matt. The water in the section we fished was low so he chose to use a raft rather than a drift boat. Because the fishing has been so great the river has gotten crowded with boats and fly fishers. Matt knew of a section of the river that was not so crowded. He told us we might not catch many fish but we'd have the river to ourselves. What a great call. On Tuesday and Wednesday, we saw no other boats. On Thursday, after lunch, we were followed by only one boat all the way down to the take out.

Dick and I like to use the two-handed rods, so Matt breaks up our float trip so we can swing flies. When he comes to a place that has a long gravel bar and some good runs we will get out of the boat and cast flies for Steelhead. Unfortunately, on

this trip we did not catch any fish swinging flies. Dick reported getting one good grab but the fish did not commit. All of our fish were caught on nymphs or rubber legs suspended under an indicator. On day one we caught 7 Steelhead and lost 2. On our second day we landed 5 fish and lost 1. On day three we hooked 5 fish and landed 4. In three days of floating the river with Matt we landed 16 steelhead although he thought we might not catch too many fish in the section we floated. In the scheme of things, I rate this trip as FANTASTIC. On past trips we have fished many days without hooking a fish. Sixteen Steelhead to the net, in three days, made it a great trip! Matt stated that this year the river is fishing better than he has seen it in ten years.

Outings Article

For a number of years, I had been the Club Outings Chairperson. From time to time, I have reflected on "What is a Club Outing?" and "What changes have occurred over the years?". I think the answer to the first question is that a Club Outing is an opportunity for a group of Club members to get together for fishing, socializing, and perhaps learning new techniques at familiar or new venues. The success of these outings leads to their becoming annual, or sometimes periodic, events. The Lower Owens Wade trip in late winter has become an annual event and the Second Saturday Surf Fishing (SSSF) a periodic event.

What changes occurred over the years? When I joined the Club in August of 1997, there were essentially two annual trips--a Fall Crowley Lake/Eastern Sierra and a Lees Ferry (Colorado River, Arizona) that were typically attended by eight or more anglers. Other trips were added, often initiated after guides and outfitters spoke at our monthly meetings when we were in the Speakers' Pool with other southern California Clubs.

So, what happened? Some of the popular guides have retired or now have other careers. We are no longer in the Speakers' Pool and the Covid pandemic occurred, which has reduced information about new trips. Travel and Lodging costs have increased. Some members that went on the annual trips have moved from our area, no longer waded or float tube, or have passed on. (If you save your newsletters, you can find a more detailed article of changes in the February 2020 issue.)

However, Club members are still fishing, but in smaller groups. One can read about these trips when reported in the Newsletter after the trip. I think many members, especially new members, would like to know about trips before they are taken. They can then plan their own trips for after fishing socializing, possible travel and lodging cost sharing and just learning more about fishing and other opportunities. To that end you are encouraged to list your trips in the Newsletter before you to take the trip. Send your name, contact information and basic trip information (e.g. dates, guide trip, wade, float tube, motel, condo, camping) to Newsletter editor, Joseph Narkevitz, at (joseph.narkevitz@gmail.com) on or before the end of the month in which you want the trip information to appear.

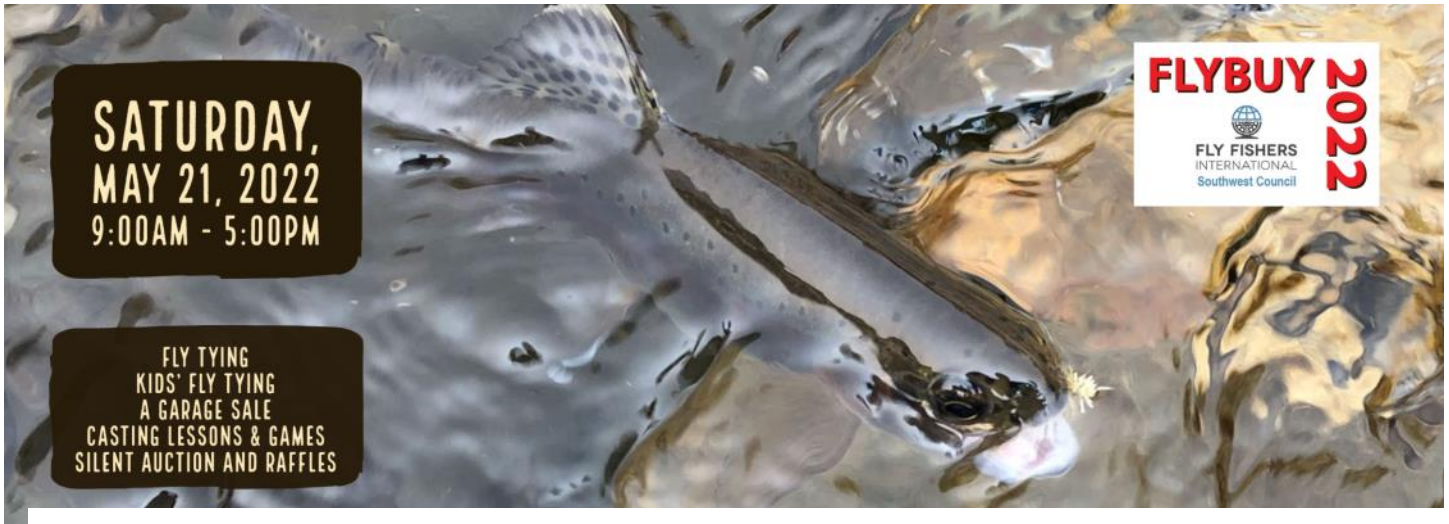
CATCH AND RELEASE FISHING COMPETITION
