Dear Members,

The Santa Barbara Flyfishers (SBFF) will hold a meeting for the general membership on **March 8, 2022**.

The main purpose for the gathering of the membership will be to discuss the direction of our club. For the past year we have not been able to meet in person. This in turn has caused a decline in paid memberships and a lack of interest in club participation.

We want you to come and give us your input, your ideas, and your suggestions. The Santa Barbara Flyfishers board of directors has been discussing several options. Here are a few of the ideas under consideration we have talked about:

From our membership we need a discussion on the future of the club. We need your ideas on how to move forward. What would you like to see happen? How would we implement those proposals?

From here we propose some options but will entertain others:

1. Elect a new board of directors to carry the club into the future. The positions that would need to be filled are as follows: President, Recording Secretary, Membership, Treasurer, Conservation, Programs, Raffles, Facilities, Outings, Youth, Fly Tying, Historian, Refreshments, Awards, and Newsletter Editors. We need a new board of directors and more volunteers to move ahead.
2. Join the Sespe Fly Fishers in Ventura, CA.

Our board has met with the Sespe Fly Fishers board of directors about keeping our club alive by joining with their club. They were most receptive to the idea.

Some advantages of our club joining forces with their club:

- They have about 150 members.
- They have an active outings program and our club members would be able to join them for trips across the USA and abroad. They also are part of a consortium of SO CA Fly Fishing clubs offering an active monthly speakers program.
- They have ongoing classes in fly-tying, rod building, and casting classes. Their meetings are in person and also broadcast through Zoom. They are in the fundraising phase of building a casting pond in Camarillo. They are in the South West Council speakers pool. That means you can hear presentations from the leading fly fishers from across the USA and Europe
- They have offered free memberships to SBFF current members for the year.
- We will continue with our Salt Saturdays and Trout in the Classroom for our area schools.

We can keep our identity as a fraternity of fly fishers in Santa Barbara on a more informal basis and still be part of a club whose objectives and purposes are like minded with ours. We will continue the **Salt Saturday** program and most likely the **Trout in the Classroom** effort as well. Attending general meetings could be a carpooling affair with an early dinner with like minded friends.

If we do this, it makes sense to dissolve our corporation as a club within the year. We must distribute our funds and assets to entities that fulfill our objectives and purposes. How this gets done is straight forward but can take many directions on to whom and



when we distribute them. One of the original visions of the club was to have a casting pond. We came close a couple of times on moving on that and as fundraisers for 25 years have excelled in generating capital for such efforts. Sespe has secured a location for a casting pond and some wind fall from our closing down as a formal club would surely help along these lines.

In addition to funds, we have a lot of gear that needs to be turned into the intentions of those who donated it.

Diane Honker's gear is now a major portion of that and there are some excellent rods and reels that Diane acquired and tuned in her remarkable fly fishing lifestyle. We have also still some items from Mike Clevenger and others. We plan to have a sale in April to give the club an opportunity to buy it. I know we can't sell it all, but what

remains can go to Sespe Fly Fishers who have excellent sales themselves and some to the Southwest Council.

I would like to see a good donation to **Casting to Recovery** in Diane's behalf in some way or the other no matter how matters turn out here.

In conclusion of my statement here I want to emphasize that it is up to you to help decide what we do.

We don't have to quit as a club, and it is up to you what kind of club we want. I can say that I'm done being President.

Someone else will have to pick that up if one is needed. Going through Diane's club paperwork and looking at the ten past club rosters all with me listed as President is profound. A Casting Pond in Ventura County!

Report from Sespe Fly Fishers Casting Pond Committee

The Casting Pond Committee has been actively working towards securing a casting pond in Ventura County at Santa Rosa Valley Park in Camarillo. This is a central location that would be accessible to our friends in Santa Barbara, and Conejo Fly Fishers to the south.

On January 20th, committee members Candice Meneghin, Karen Hall and Earl Arnold met with the **Santa Rosa Valley Municipal Advisory Council** via Zoom to discuss our offer to install a casting pond at Santa Rosa Valley Park. Candice introduced Karen and Earl who made a presentation about Casting Ponds, and then fielded questions from various members of the committee including County Supervisor Linda Parks, and parks manager Jeri Cooper.

The presentation was very well received. Some concerns were raised which are being currently being addressed: What would be the source of water for the pond? Where would the pond drain when it is emptied periodically for cleaning? What would be used for algae and mosquito mitigation? One of the advisors asked if the pond had to be a rectangular shape, as something more curving might be more aesthetically appealing.

Earl assured the group that we would use biologic additives that are environmentally friendly in the pond as much as possible, which pleased everyone, and that we would address the other concerns, especially look into water and draining options.

Ultimately, Municipal Advisory Council members were unanimous in their support of the pond for the opportunities it would offer for outdoor education for all citizens, especially youth, in our region in future. The fact that it would also provide opportunities for conservation education was also appealing.

Post meeting, follow up has been with Ventura County Park Deputy Director Colter Chisholm who is taking our proposal seriously. In a recent conversation he said that it appeared that there would be enough water in their existing allocation for the park to provide the needed water for the pond. He is also seeking confirmation that the concrete pond location that Sespe Fly Fishers prefers would meet existing flood plain regulations, as it is near Conejo Creek. He had spoken to one flood official who said it appeared to meet the criteria. Another concern that was raised involved drainage for the pond. Tom Hall and Earl Arnold are enthusiastically working out a solution involving a center drain and a pipeline to pump the water into the landscape to help irrigate trees and other area plantings, and to help with dust mitigation, rather than having the water drain directly into Conejo Creek.

SFF President, Earl Arnold was able to develop a site plan drawing of a pond which would have two straight sides for casting, and two curving sides to address the aesthetic appeal.

Steve Schalla has spoken with several volunteer architects, engineers and grading contractors who can help save money on development costs. Eric from **Eric's Tackle** shop has offered to assist with fundraising, and writer Bob Semerau has volunteered to help promote the project as needed. **Conejo Valley Fly Fishers** and **Santa Barbara Fly Fishers** have offered their support as well.

All in all, this project has received a lot of enthusiastic support, and so far, shows great promise. We hope to develop a contract or Memorandum of Understanding with Ventura County over the next few months which will allow us to focus on fundraising and development for the project. Although we aren't ready to pour concrete, we are inching closer to our goal.
